














OUR 2021 ACROSS SCHOOL TEACHERS

The Effective Teacher Profile is a Professional learning resource for teachers that seeks to improve the educational achievement of Māori and Pasifika students in schools.


Key elements within this are that effective teachers take a positive, non deficit view of students, and see themselves as capable of making a difference for them. Effective interactions rely on caring for students by building relationships and interactions, having high expectations and managing the classroom to promote learning. Teachers are encouraged to use a range of dynamic, interactive teaching styles, with teachers and students reflecting together on student achievement to move forward collaboratively.

The work has been going on over the past 12 months and continues into 2021 and beyond. It is an exciting challenge for all staff and schools as we all continue to improve the learning outcomes for all students.
