
Auckland Central Catholic Kāhui Ako KIRIBATI SPEECH COMPETITION

Speech categories

Years 7-8	My culture: What part(s) of your Kiribati culture are important to you.	1.30-2.30minutes		
Years 9-10	My language: How do we sustain the language of Kiribati?	2-3minutes		
Seniors	Proverb: Choose a Kiribati Proverb/saying and explain the meaning and importance of it. How does it relate to you on a personal level?	2.30-3.30minutes		

A minimum and a maximum of minutes has been set. Contestants may wear traditional costumes, use traditional props if they wish, however marks will not be awarded for this unless the items are part of their speech.

Judging

The judging will focus on these areas

The judges will allocate marks with the total for each section outlined above. The areas to be judged are:

- 1. Speech Construction: Introduction uses a Samoan greeting appropriate for the occasion. Gains audience attention; organization flow of speech;

 Main points developed. Conclusion audience left with something to think about.
- 2. **Delivery:** Clarity of speech; pace; tone variation; deportment; gestures; facial expressions; enunciation.
- **3. Appeal:** Eye to eye contact; maintaining interest; interaction through the camera; appropriateness of language, tone and gestures. STUDENTS MUST WEAR THEIR SCHOOL UNIFORM unless they are dressed in their cultural costume.
- 4. **Language:** Deliver their speech in accordance with appropriate protocol of a male/female; correct grammar and structure; good word selection; variation of sentence starters/structures, and correct pauses. Fluency and accurate pronunciation.
- 5. **Research evidence:** acknowledges source(s) of information. Uses it appropriately, effectively and relevantly.
- 6. **Overall Effectiveness:** Impact on judge; originality; topic choice through to general feeling about the speech as a whole.
- 7. **Time Penalty:** There will be a penalty of 1 mark if the speaker goes 20 seconds above the allocated time AND 2 marks off if the speech is 20 seconds less than the allocated time. See time limits.
